



Requiem by Gabriel Fauré

Gabriel Fauré (1845-1924) was a French composer and teacher, trained as an organist and choirmaster. He is widely regarded as one of the greatest masters of French song, composing 6 song cycles and over 50 individual songs. He is also well known for his instrumental and chamber works, including many pieces for the piano.

Fauré began work on his Requiem in 1887, in his own words "purely for the pleasure of it". The death of his father in 1885 and of his mother in 1887 may well have influenced him. He wrote numerous versions of the Requiem, but the first was premiered in Paris in 1888. The text of the Catholic Requiem Mass, or Mass for the Dead, is standard but Fauré did not follow it exactly. He preferred to make a personal selection of texts, emphasizing the idea of rest and peace and paying little attention to the Day of Judgement. We are grateful to the singers and instrumentalists who have joined the Trinity Chancel Choir and soloists today. We hope that this beautiful and intense music will accompany you on your Lenten journey.
